HELENA, Jan. 4th, 1893.

The Clinton County Regiment was considered by military men as being one of the best in the large army gathered here. On every expedition from this point some regiments have been censured for bad conduct, but as yet I have not heard one word of imputation of wrong laid upon the 26th. I can assure you that so far we have good reason to be proud of them. Our friends in the 26th will begin, I am sure, to have me state that their Quartermaster, Capt. J. H. Flint, has proven to be just the man for that position. His energy is all devoted to the discharge of his duties, and his efforts appreciated by the regiment.

I can only compliment the Medical corps and various officers of the regiment in a body. The fine condition of the men speaks well for those in charge of them. There is a great regret in the entire regiment at the loss of our fellow townsman, Lieut. Col. Magill.

The facts in relation to him have been so distorted by some articles that have appeared in print, as to do him sad injustice. He is every inch a soldier, and the regiment is a unit in wishing for his return.

Seventh Iowa Cavalry.

The State authorities have disbanded the regimental organizations of the 42d and 43d Infantry, revoked commissions issued for the same, and ordered all recruits—excepting the companies—enlisted for the former to report at Davenport, and those of the latter at Ottumwa. The two companies reserved are destined—one for the purpose of completing the organization of the 6th Iowa Cavalry, and one for the 14th Iowa Infantry. The balance are consolidated and will form the basis of the 7th Iowa Cavalry. The regimental officers of the 7th will be in part as follows: Colonel, S. W. Summers; Lieut. Col. G. M. O'Brien, and Major, H. H. Heath.

Rev. Lyman Beecher, father of Henry Ward Beecher, died at his residence in Brooklyn, N. Y., on Saturday evening last, aged eighty-seven years.

Col. Shaw, of the 14th Iowa, is here to-day on his way to Helena, where he will proceed to raise a brigade.
