PREFACE.

26th March, 1898.

The facts herein collected are the result of five years' research among the records of Rhode Island, and a careful examination of all publications in which the name of "King" appears. Much valued information has been gathered from interviews and correspondence had with living representatives of the "King" family in Rhode Island and elsewhere, and no member has been assigned a place in these pages without direct proof or the strongest collateral evidence that he sprung from Clement King, of Marshfield, Mass., and later of Providence, Rhode Island.

The early records of the Providence Plantations leave many genealogical problems unsolved, but the few assumptions that the compiler has made are clearly indicated and explained in the foot notes.

The fact that an unusually large number of the earlier settlers of Plymouth Colony and New England were named "King" makes the task of tracing their several descendants difficult. As a matter of interest and general convenience the following list of families has been made, giving the name of the first known ancestor on this continent.

- I The King Family of Marshfield, Mass Clement King.
- II The King Family of Lynn, Mass. Daniel King.
- III The King Family of Salem, Mass. William King.
- IV The King Family of Taunton, Mass. Philip King.
 - V The King Family of Weymouth, Mass. John King.
 - VI The King Family of Westfield, Mass. John King.
- VII The King Family of Northampton, Mass. John King.
- VIII The King Family of Watertown, Mass. John King.
 - IX The King Family of Plymouth, Mass. Samuel King.
 - X The King Family of Scituate, Mass. Thomas King.

None of the above-enumerated families can be proven to be related, although there is a strong probability that John King of Weymouth was the ancestor of or related to families I, II, IV, V, VI, VIII.

The publication of these memoranda has been undertaken to preserve from entire loss the data of a family rapidly disappearing from the State of Rhode Island, and in the hope that some more worthy historian may be spurred on to the task of expanding these pages into a volume fit to be entitled a "King Family Record." Doubtless many mistakes of detail may be found in these notes concerning which the compiler would esteem it a favor to be placed right, and any corrections or criticism of what has been done will always be gladly received and obtain attention.

The compiler desires to acknowledge his indebtedness and to extend his thanks to Rufus King, of Yonkers, N. Y., for the uniform courtesy, interest and aid given on many occasions, and for the loan of important manuscripts bearing upon the subject in hand; to Mr. John Osborne Austin and Mr. Edward Field, both of Providence, R. I., for valued suggestions and information; and to Mrs. Harriet Ruth Cooke for the record of Governor Samuel Ward King and his descendants.

Finally it is desired that this work may win the attention of all interested in Clement King and his line, and result in the production of further information and family documents from his descendants wherever they may be.

THE KING FAMILY.

1 CLEMENT¹ KING first appears as constable of Marshfield, Mass., in 1668 and 1670, but the records of that town fail to disclose whence he came or to which of the several King families then in Plymouth Colony he was akin.

He was proposed as a Freeman in 1681 and was duly admitted to the full rights of franchise on 6th June, 1682. From the fact that Philip King, of Taunton, Mass., was admitted a Freeman on the same day, and that both Clement and Philip King named their eldest sons John, it has been surmised that they were closely related, if not brothers, and, perhaps, sons of that John King, of Weymouth, of whom Savage gives reliable data. As yet, however, nothing has been found to prove the statement. There is no doubt, however, that Clement King was the first and only man to bear that name in the colony. He was a member of the 4th Co. or Train Band of Providence, R. I., in Jan., 1686. In a list of the Marshfield townsmen, dated 21st May, 1688, his name is marked with a cross, indicating his removal to Providence, R. I., where he bought land at Pawtuxet, on the west bank of the Pauchassett river, of Ephraim Carpenter, on 20 May, 1687.

In August, 1688, his name appears in a tax-rate list, rated at 2s. 9d., and his personal estate consisted of a horse, cow, 5 heifers, 2 four-year steers and a team of oxen. The name of his wife was Elizabeth ———————, and he must have died about 1694, at Providence, R. I., for she married, on 12 November of that year, the Rev. Thomas Barnes, pastor of the 2nd Baptist church, at Swanzey, Mass. Rev. Thomas Barnes died 8th June, 1706, and his wife Elizabeth, formerly the widow of Clement King, died in 1708. Her inventory, taken at Swanzey, 27 December, 1708, consisted of lands, clothing and household goods to the amount of £112 7s. 10d., and administration thereon was granted to her eldest son, John King, of Providence, R. I.

2 John² King (Clement¹), of Providence, R. I., appears on 3 March, 1695-96, with one Peleg Rhodes as an appraiser on the estate of Joshua Turner, of whom Joanna Turner was administratrix. (Providence Town Council Book I, page 24.) On 2 December, 1695, he bought from John Aldrich land beyond the 7 mile run (Book 2 of Deeds, p. 372), and, on 22 April, 1697, he leased to Thomas Barnes for two years a dwelling house and 60 acres of land, together with ten neat cattle, cart, plough and utensils, for £6 10s. per year, but reserved for his own use the leanto fireroom and room over the cellar.

On 14 Jan., 1707, he acquired by deed from Andrew Harris certain Pawtuxet land, and on 9 June, 1707, was engaged as constable, being designated as John King, of Socanosset (Prov. Town Meeting Records, Vol. I, p. 67). On 29 Oct., 1707, he appealed to the Assembly from the judgment of a Court of Common Pleas recovered by Joseph Carpenter, of Musketo Cove, Long Island, in an action of trespass and ejectment. The judgment was sustained on appeal, and the parties agreed that Joseph Carpenter should pay John King £20 for the use of the children of William Vinson, deceased, and that John King

should surrender possession of the house and lands sued for. On 12 March, 1711-12, he acquired by deed from Josiah Westcott, lands at Mashantatuck, and, on 19 April, 1711-12, by deed from Stephen Potter, other lands in that vicinity.

On 20 Nov., 1711, "John King, of Providence, weaver," deeded to John Stone, of Warwick, R. I., certain lands at Mashantatuck, consisting of a house and 50 acres, and, on 19 March, 1715-16, deeded to John Mowry land in Providence on the east side of the 7 mile run. On 22 Dec., 1715, he acquired by deed from Joseph Whipple certain Westquadnaig land. About this period the widow of Joseph Aldrich was committed to the care of "John King, of Mashantatuck" and £4 paid him for keeping her (Town Council Records, Vol. I, p. 69), and, on 27 Oct., 1716, in a report of the Committee on Town Debt, "To John King for keeping Mary Aldrich two years and two months, £20 10s. 6d." On 14 February, 1718-19, "John King, weaver," and Elizabeth, his wife, deeded to Andrew Harris his farm, excepting two poles square of land "where my Father, my child and Joshua Turner are buried." On 11 March, 1717-18, he deeded to "his brother, Thomas King," land on the west side of seven mile run, and, on 25 May, 1719, he deeded to Othniel Gorton other lands on the west side of seven mile run. He died 18 September, 1723, and, on 11 November, 1723, administration on his estate was granted to his widow Elizabeth. His inventory amounted to £299 2s., consisting of real estate, £1,213, viz: the old farm, £600; the home farm at Soconosset, £420; the land on the plain, £120, and other

lands, £73; personal estate, 6 cows, 2 heifers, 5 calves, 2 mares, 2 colts, 16 swine, a team of oxen, 45 sheep, 7 geese, 3 tame turkeys, fowls, 2 hides in the tan vat, apples in the orchard making 25 barrels of cider, 20 loads of hay, a cider mill, shoemaker's tools, pair of worsted combs, wearing apparel, £9 gold and 8s. silver monéy. The rooms named were the "great room, kitchen bed room, great chamber, leanto chamber, closet and garret." On the same day the bond of Elizabeth King, widow, as administratrix of her husband, Mr. John King, deceased, was filed in the Probate Court, dated 11 November, 1723, in the sum of £608 10s. 4d., with James King and Samuel Fish as sureties, and witnessed by Richard Knight and Joseph Olney. Another bond of £600 was given by John Wilson, of East Greenwich, that Elizabeth King, widow of Mr. John King, makes distribution among the children of said John King. On 18 March, 1738, Elizabeth King, widow, of Smithfield, R. I., deeded to "her son Josiah" land at Smithfield for the sum of £200. She appears to have died on 27 November, 1754, for, on the 3 March, 1755, administration on the estate of Elizabeth King, of Cranston, R. I., was granted to her eldest son John. The inventory amounted to £319 15s.

John² King (*Clement*¹) seems to have married twice, first, to Hannah ————, of whom no issue is known, and, second, to Elizabeth ————, who survived him. His children by the latter were:

- 3 James² King (*Clement*), of Providence, later of Gloucester, R. I. He is first mentioned on 16 June, 1713, as being taxed 7s. 3d., and on 10 August, 1719, he deeded to James Thornton 150 acres of land for £88. On 27 September, 1721, he deeded his son James, out of love and affection, one-half of 150 acres of land on the west side of

seven mile run. On 12 January, 1724-25, he, calling himself "yeoman," deeded to James Thornton, Jr., land at Westquadnaig. On 24 September, 1728, he deeded his son Thomas, for love, etc., 75 acres; on 17 January, 1730, he deeded his son Amos, for love, etc., 198 acres; on 12 June, 1731, at Gloucester, R. I., he deeded his son Clement the 100 acres where I dwell. These several deeds of land were probably made to his sons as they came of age. On 8 November, 1742, he made up the account and gave bond for his wife Persis, who was the administratrix of the personal estate of her former husband, William Brooks, deceased. He died on 19th November, 1756, as is shown by the following extract from Gloucester records: "This may inform you that our ancient brother, James King, of Gloucester, departed this life on the 19th day of November, A. D. 1756, which we desire you would enter on your records. To the Town Clerk of Gloucester. (Signed) Samuel Winsor, Mary Winsor, John Winsor, Joshua Winsor, Elizabeth Winsor. Received 21 February, 1757. Recorded by Richard Steere, T. Clerk." James² King was married (2d) Persis Brooks (widow of William Brooks and daughter of William Turpin, on 13 October, 1734, by Elder Samuel Winsor, at Gloucester, R. I., but had no issue by her. The names of but four of his children are known, viz.:

4 THOMAS² KING (Clement¹), of Providence, R. I., was born 1691, and died at Providence 1723, October 10, unmarried. On 8 January, 1719, he deeded to Benjamin Wight for £30 a half share of land on the west side of seven mile run. In this deed he is described as "husbandman." His will is dated 1 October, 1723, and was proved at Providence 11 November, 1723. His friend William Turpin is named sole executor, and the will is witnessed by Robert Currie, Joseph Browne and Joseph Jenckes. He directs the sale of all his lands, and his brother, Richard Harris, to have the refusal of same £5 cheaper than another will give. He gives his brother John a chest, some wearing apparel and husbandry tools; to his nephew, Richard Harris, Jr., the sum of £10; to his friend, William Turpin, the sum of £5; to his brother John King's eldest son and his brother Ebenezer King's eldest son the rest of his estate equally. The inventory amounted to £12 19s., and consisted of a Bible and other small books, 12s.; apparel, £11 1s. 6d.; an ink horn, pen knife and paper, 2s. 6d.; a chest and old linen, 12s.

5 EBENEZER² KING (*Clement*¹), of Watertown, Mass., then of Tiverton, and later of East Greenwich, R. I. On 17 December, 1699, he was married at Watertown, Mass., to *Hannah Manning*, daughter of Samuel and Abiah (Wight) Manning, of Billerica, Mass. Their children were:

NOTE. — The fact that Ebenezer² King (Clement¹) was at Watertown, Mass., in 1699, and that from Watertown, Mass., in 1740, came Richard King, son of John and Mary (Sewell) King, the ancestor of the celebrated Rufus and William King, of Kittery, Maine, may point to a relationship that is traditional among certain of Clement King's descendants.

6 John³ King (John², Clement¹), of Providence, later of Cranston, R. I., was born at Providence 1705, March 13, and died at Cranston, 1790, December 13. He is first mentioned on 10 February, 1724, when he represented to the Town Council of Providence that the lands of his late father, John King, would be cut up and mangled if they should be then divided among the children according to the law of the colony, and that the interests of said children would be sacrificed by reason of their several shares in said lands being so small, if so divided. The council thereupon

ordered that all the lands, after the widow thirds, be intrusted to son, John King, on his paying into the council the value of said lands in money or bills of credit, as the value of said lands are appraised, so that the council may, on receipt of the money, pay it over to the widow, who has taken administration to bring up the younger children. A bond was accordingly filed in the Probate Court of "John King, yeoman, son of John King, deceased," in the sum of £93 17s. 8d., to the Providence Town Council, dated 14 September, 1724, "to account for the sum of £46 18s. 10d. of the estate of his honored Father, John King, and for the benefit of his brothers and sisters." This bond was witnessed by John Angell and Richard Waterman, Jr.

On 14 September, 1724, he deeded, describing himself as "of Mashantatuck, yeoman, son of John King, deceased," to William Carpenter, certain land in Mashantatuck," being land my honored Father, John King, formerly purchased. His will is dated 13 December, 1790, and was proved 28 May, 1791. In the will he names his son Asa sole executor, and speaks of himself as "far advanced in years." Mentions his sons Jeremiah and Asa, his daughters Comfort Carpenter, Abigail Potter, Elizabeth Baker, and his grandsons John Carpenter, Benjamin Potter, Amos Baker and Joseph King, son of Asa King.

There is reason to believe, however, that he had another son, probably named John, for the will of Hope Corp, dated 4 December, 1762, proved 30 September, 1765, at Cranston, R. I. (his Father-in-law), of Cranston, R. I., gives to his sons-in-law, John King's *three* sons, the sum

of £50 each, and to the two daughters the sum of £25 each. He married —— Corp, the daughter of Hope and MADE THE (Rhoades) Corp. Their children were:

7 FEARNOT³ KING (*John*², *Clement*¹), of Providence, R. I. He calls himself "husbandman," and died 23 July, 1745. On 12 August, 1745, administration upon his personal estate was granted to his widow, Anne King, and his inventory, taken by Joseph Waterman and Edward Sheldon, amounted to £463 IIs. He was married on 16 July,

1732, by John Potter, Assistant, to Anne Briggs, daughter of Richard and Susannah (Spencer) Briggs, of East Greenwich, R. I. His wife was born 1715, Oct. 25, and apparently he had no issue at the date of his death.

8 Isaac³ King (John², Clement¹), of Providence, later of Scituate, R. I., was born about 1711, and died at Scituate, R. I., on 5 July, 1757. He was admitted as freeman at Providence on 6 May, 1729, and first purchased land at Scituate on 6 November, 1733. He married at Providence about 1732 to Elizabeth Bates, daughter of Samuel and Mary (——) Bates. Samuel Bates, his Father-in-law, who purchased land at Scituate before 1731, died 9th April, 1746, leaving a will dated 16 February, 1743, in which he mentions his sons John and Nathan, his daughter Margaret and his wife Mary (who died 1764, July 5). He bequeaths "to granddaughter Mary King 40 shillings, when she attains the age of eighteen years; to granddaughter Elizabeth King the same amount; to grandson Samuel King £3, when twenty-one years old; to granddaughter Mercy King 40 shillings." Inventory, £826 16s 6d. Isaac3 King's first wife, Elizabeth, died about 1740, and he then was married to Sarah Moon, on 26 April, 1741, by Job Randall, Justice. His will is dated 16 April, 1752, and was proved 1 August, 1757. In it he mentions wife Sarah, sons Samuel, Joshua and Isaac, daughters Mary, Elizabeth and Mercy, and four youngest daughters Sarah, Keziah, Lois and Prudence, and directing the division of certain household goods between his wife and the seven daughters. He names his wife Sarah and his brother, Obadiah King, of

Providence, as executrix and executor, respectively, and directs: "My will further is that my executors put my son Isaac to learn a trade as soon as he is of a suitable age, and also all my other children be by them put out as soon as they are old enough." His inventory amounted to £989 Is. Sarah King, his widow, married Joseph Jencks, of Providence, R. I., in April, 1760.

9 Josiah³ King (John², Clement¹) was born at Providence, 1716, December 3, and died at Johnston, R. I., on 13 April, 1800. His will is dated 1 October, 1799, and proved 26 April, 1800. In it he names his son, William Borden King, and Caleb Alverson, as his executors, and states that he is "far advanced in years." The will mentions his wife Mary, his sons Abner, Reuben and William Borden, and his daughter Hannah Alverson. Inventory amounted to \$642.42. His widow, Mary King, also left a will, mentioning her son, William Borden King, and her grandchildren Alverson. Josiah³ King was married first to Hannah Field (who died about 1748) on 13 December, 1741, by Ezekiel Warner, Assistant, and second to Mary Borden, daughter of Moxey (spelled also Mercy and Marcy) and Meribah Borden, on 5 November, 1749, by Joseph Harris, Justice. His second wife was born 1 November, 1716, and died 29 August, 1810. His children were as follows:
